

accomplishes this for the NTMP. Using the 3 days following the date of postmark does this for the Notice of Timber Operations.

Section 1090.6 is needed to make specific Section 4593.3, Public Resources Code which sets forth in general terms the minimum requirements for the contents of a NTMP. The introductory paragraph is necessary to provide direction on the purpose to be served by the NTMP. Subsections (a) through (c) are needed to establish who is responsible for meeting the various requirements of the Act and other rules of the Board. Subsection (d) makes specific the land description to be covered by the NTMP. Subsection (e) alerts the reviewer and the public of which forest district regulations apply to the NTMP.

Subsection (f) provides information on other uses on the ownership which may impact uses proposed under the NTMP. Subsection (g) makes specific subsection (f) of Section 4593.3, PRC and information to support those statements for the record. Subsection (h) provides information necessary to determine what future management actions may have to be accounted for in the environmental review. Subsection (i) requires listing of specific activities which will again provide information on potential impacts which may result from plan implementation.

Subsection (j) is needed to determine if the proposed NTMP will result in the required standard of "sustained yield" (PRC 4593.2(e)). Subsection (k) requires information needed to protect archaeological or historical resources. Subsection (l) requires a listing of unique areas which must be disclosed to determine if it is necessary to require additional protection. Subsection (m) is needed to determine if part of the ownership has been removed from the productive land base.

Subsection (n) allows determination of the areas where state stocking standards have not been met and areas where there is overlapping environmental documents (THPs). Subsection (o) is needed to obtain information to determine if endangered species law requirements are being met. Subsection (p) is necessary to obtain information necessary to protect water quality and remain consistent with water quality laws. Subsection (q) is needed to obtain information to evaluate if proper protections are provided for soil productivity (PRC 4551.5). Subsection (r) requires information on the existing and proposed road system to determine potential impacts from the transportation system. Subsection (s) provides information on how the resource conservation standards of the Act will be met (PRC 4561).
